My Time at PYDS: An Experience Full of Joy!

As a Fulbright English Teaching Assistant, I have spent the last 9 months at PYDS assisting with active English teaching and curriculum. When I first saw PYDS, I was a little bit in awe of its environment. Surrounded by lush green hills, wild flowers growing everywhere, and playful monkeys lurking in the tree branches, I found that the school was a vibrant and energetic learning space. This became even more apparent to me as I began to meet the students and teachers of the school - I found every student that I encountered to be bright, energetic and curious about the world. Additionally their teachers were not only brilliant and creative in their fields of study, but also warm, compassionate, joyful, and motivated. In my time here, both the students and the teachers have taught me how to be a better learner, a better teacher, and a better member of my community. I had a ton of fun working with students on different activities related to learning English over these 9 months. With class 8, we conducted a short pen-pal exchange with two schools in the U.S. With the class 7 girls, we conducted a pen-pal exchange with the class 7 students of Him Jyoti School. With class 5 and 6 students, we made paper Jack O' Lanterns to celebrate Halloween and bookmarks to learn about the 5 Ws of reading comprehension. In the Vocational Program, we learned about literary genres and created short story collections. We also got to know each other better through daily English conversation circles. None of these activities would have been possible without the guidance, leadership, and support of the amazing PYDS teachers I got to work with.

In addition to my official role as an English Teaching Assistant, I also had the opportunity to fill the role of Santa Claus during the school's Christmas celebration in December. Being able to make the students and teachers laugh as I did my best impression of Santa is one of my favorite memories from my time here.

It is very difficult to capture the breadth of my experience in a few words. Being at PYDS was truly such a special experience that will always hold a big place in my heart. Here, there is a sense of community and togetherness, unlike anything I have ever experienced. Whether it was having a laugh in the staff room, eating samosa for someone's birthday, or chatting in between classes with giggling students, I will always reflect on my time at PYDS as one that was full of joy. I will miss everyone who has made my time here so rich and full of love and laughter, but I feel confident that we will meet again.



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
