These times have demanded a significant shift in the methods of imparting learning. Though we continue to take advantage of pre-established models of teaching and learning, we are also making simultaneous efforts to evolve and improve. Staying true to this premise, we recently provided laptops to our teachers so as to enhance their digital teaching capabilities.



The need to equip our teachers with laptops arose from difficulties they were facing in taking online classes and managing the storage of a large amount of content that is exchanged daily. Consequently, we have equipped our academic staff with technology tools and training so that they are able to effectively impart classes online, document their academic work, and up-skill themselves to effectively use these methods of instruction post-pandemic. In addition, we have been in constant touch with our students and provided them with the basic study aids for online learning i.e. mobile devices, phone recharges, etc.

Why there cannot be a better time than this to squeeze the maximum out of hybrid learning methods? Let's find this out in the words of <a href="Mr. Prabhat Williams">Mr. Prabhat Williams</a>, our Physics Teacher.




"Being a physics teacher, hands-on knowledge is a huge part of the curriculum. Taking online classes has been a challenge for us all. When all we had were our mobile devices, it became an even bigger challenge. Although they provide us with a lot of facilities, taking online classes still remains a hindrance. We all are very thankful for the opportunity of getting laptops for the online classes, it made things easier. We can now not

only look at the students who are paying attention but also share presentations with them. The hybrid classes have been a blessing as we can even show relevant videos of the syllabus. The students have also told us about the fun and informative sessions they had since the hybrid classes started. Not only this, the laptops have helped us with storage and uploading/downloading student information which was a very big task before."

# **Going Hybrid**

On 24th August 2021, we welcomed 138 students (60-day scholars and 78 residential) - being Phase 1 of the physical re-opening of our School. The residential children had faced severe connectivity issues as most of them live in remote parts of Uttarakhand. Some of our day scholars faced similar hardships as well as adverse family and residential conditions. Hence, after a lot of deliberation, we introduced hybrid classes. In the hybrid classes, the teachers conduct brick-and-mortar and online classes simultaneously teaching the same content to students present in class and home alike using a laptop.






This model has resulted in a significant improvement in children's learning, as students who were lagging are catching up with the curriculum relatively quickly.

We were able to overcome various challenges and managed to provide a safe learning environment to our students by ensuring staff vaccination, isolation wards, and health check-up programs for students. We also required hostel students to bring negative RTPCR reports at the time of reporting.

# **Future-proofing our Infrastructure**

As the Government of Uttarakhand did not permit
physical reopening of classes for the primary section
till very recently, we continue to conduct online
classes for these students. However, starting 27th
September, all the students of the Secondary and Senior
Secondary Section are coming to school. Given there is
no further need to continue the hybrid model, teachers
are making use of the audio-visual resources by

connecting their laptops with the televisions/projectors that are installed in the classrooms.





We further plan to:

a) Develop physical digital infrastructure on the school campus - classrooms, library, and labs - so that technology can continue to be used for teaching and learning after school reopening. We have installed Wi-Fi, with fast internet connectivity that covers virtually our entire Campus. This is to facilitate the use of the Internet by teachers in classrooms and students while studying, in the library, and such like.

b) Equip teachers with technology tools and training so that they are efficiently imparting classes online, documenting their academic work, and up-skilling themselves to use these methods of instruction, postpandemic.


# **Remembering Our Founder**

### **Half Yearly Examinations**

After 18 months of lockdown, we were able to conduct on-site exams for classes 6-12. The exams were a combination of written papers, cross-curricular projects, and viva. The objective was to identify skill and content gaps so that the teachers can tailor their instruction based on the outcome of these exams. We hope the outcome of this half-yearly will bring about an acceleration in learning for our students for the remainder of the year.

#### **Covid-19 Relief Support**

Amid the raging COVID-19 second wave, four of our students lost their fathers due to the virus. We have been able to facilitate one-time monetary support of Rs.30,000/- from our donors to these families. This has come in as a great relief to them. We are also providing all the necessary support to these children.

We have also given admission to two very bright siblings in our School. They lost their father due to COVID-19. He was the sole earning member. Their circumstances turned very tragic when their grandparents decided to abandon them. We have now taken them into our care.
