We are delighted to share that our team of talented teachers of the Computer department, led by <u>Ms. Geetanjali Jaggi</u> was bestowed the award of "The Best Teacher – UP & UTTARAKHAND ZONE" for SOF NATIONAL CYBER OLYMPIAD for the year 2019-20 by the Academic Council of Science Olympiad Foundation.

Under their competent guidance and varied initiatives, students of our School collectively performed very well among more than 56,000 schools from across 32 countries in the SOF NATIONAL CYBER OLYMPIAD exam, conducted during the academic year 2019-20. We are very proud of them all.

Thanks to support of our generous donors, we were able to continue with COVID-19 relief efforts for the families of our students hit hardest by the pandemic. Our teams delivered essentials to 58 families from 32 villages/areas in our extended vicinity. We also took the initiative of refilling LPG cylinders as well as recharging phones so that students could continue with their distance learning.

Our COVID-19 relief team shortlisted another 60 needy families of our students through Samvad and re-assessment surveys.

These families will be helped in the third phase of our relief support during September. With the abatement of rains, we will try and enhance our geographic outreach as well.

Hailing from a marginalized family of Purkal village, Vaishali Thakur joined us in 2004. Keen to study, she excelled in school and completed her Bachelor's in Pharmacy under our On to Life Program. This program helps with both securing admissions/scholarships as well as covers the financial needs of our students by providing interest and security free

loans to meet tuition and living expenses during the course of study. These loans are interest free and repayable on soft terms from future income. Vaishali is currently



working as Senior Drug Safety Associate performing pharmacovigilance activities with Bioclinica. She has repaid the entire sum loaned to her from her earnings. In addition to this, with a view to helping future generations of her community grow and succeed, she has now chosen to become a donor to the Society. We feel immense joy in her success and empathy, which are also a great reaffirmation of our ideals and efforts.
